Too Few Women Get Counseling Before Breast Cancer Gene ...

Genetic counseling is recommended before and after a genetic test. The United States Preventive Services Task Force, a group of health experts, recommends that women with specific patterns of breast, ovarian, tubal, or peritoneal cancer in their family history consider genetic counseling and testing for BRCA gene mutations.

Women who have already been diagnosed with breast cancer: Most doctors agree that not all women with breast cancer need genetic counseling and testing. For any woman continuing to have relationship issues and/or distress, mental health counseling should be an option.
